- High-minded thoughts simply expressed
- Rhythmic repetitions
- Poetic quotations
- Elegant sentence structures
- Exhortations to greatness or altruism
- A focus on the "valence" issues (freedom, equality, democracy, community, etc.)
- A display of wisdom: an ability to look below the surface to locate universal truths
- A striking new phrase, insight, or perspective that uplifts the audience
- An expression of emotion that touches some deep feelings or beliefs (e.g., national anthems like *The Star-Spangled Banner* or *La Marseillaise*)
- The skillful weaving of a theme or motif from beginning to end of the text
- A stirring call for engagement or involvement by the audience
- A topic that reveals the speaker's deepest instincts or values
- The persuasive resolution of some ongoing conflict or contradict
